You will have chosen tasks that at least total 3 chillis. Your homework will show that you understand the topic but you need to work on how you represent your knowledge. There may be some inaccuracies in your knowledge.




You have chosen homework of only 1 or 2 chilli strength and you have completed it with some accuracy. Or you have chosen a medium strength chilli task with some effort.

EXTRAS (INFORMATION)


Train your brain.

Design a game that will teach or test the knowledge of one particular GCSE Topic.

DISPLAY PLATTER (DISPLAY BOARD)

There are lots of display boards around the PE area. Use your knowledge and design skills to create a informative GCSE PE display board.

POD STICKERS (POD CAST)

You can learn by listening. Put together a podcast for one particular topic so you and others can revise.

FLIPPED FISH (FLIPPED LEARNING)

Flipped learning is where students learn the content of a topic at home.This might be through a presentation, information booklet or video. Put together a flipped learning resource on a topic of your choice.

LOTUS SONG

Feeling musical, then this one is for you.Turn a topic of your choice into a beautiful song or a beat breaking rap.

TEST "FUN" DUE (MAKE A FUN TEST)

Design a fun way to test your class mates.

U TEACH TU (TEACH SOMEONE ELSE)

We remember best when we teach others. Learn a topic and teach someone else.This might be another student, a younger student or a family member.You need to evidence this so we can see your teaching at work.

BLOG SUM (WRITE A LEARNING BLOG)

Put together a blog that journals your learning journey in GCSE PE.What did you learn today? What did you enjoy? What do you need to learn better?

U DO TUBE (VIDEO ON YOUTUBE)

Put together a youtube video about GCSE PE or a particular topic. Make sure it helps someone else to learn.

TAKE AWAY TU

Use your knowledge and design abilities to create your own takeaway dishes for future GCSE PE classes.

TOP TRUMP ICE CREAM

Top Trumps is a great game and you can learn with it too. Choose a topic where there are a number of statistics and put together your own cards that you can use and play with friends.

DESSERTS

HOT CROSS WORD

Create a crossword that tests your classmates knowledge of a particular topic.

YUM YUM WONG (2 FACTS AND A LIE)

Put together a series of powerpoint slides that have 2 facts and lie related to GCSE PE. Play this with your class.

PICTURE PIE (PICTIONARY GAME)

Do you love to draw? Put together a series of cards that have key GCSE PE words and play a pictionary game with your class mates.

POETIC PIE (WRITE A POEM)

Write a poem about GCSE PE.

CHOCOLATE CHIP RESOURCE (MAKE A LEARNING RESOURCE)

Learning mats, information posters, leaflets, podcasts, presentations, videos are all formats that you can create learning resources in. Do you know any others?

TABOO FRUIT (PLAY TABOO)

Taboo is a fun game. Create key word cards with 3 words on each that the player can not use when describing that word. Play with your classmates.

STICKY TOFFEE WEBSITE (BUILD A GCSE PE WEBSITE)

Are you technically savvy? Then build your own GCSE PE website for other students to learn the subject.

COMIC GATEAU (DESIGN A COMIC STORY/ STORYBOARD/PHOTO BOARD)

Create a story of a topic and put this together in a comic book or a story board.

3D SUNDAY

(3D MODEL THAT ILLUSTRATES A TOPIC) Create a 3D model that demonstrates your knowledge of a particular topic.
