Frequently Asked Questions

Year 9 Maths

- Why is Year 9 Maths graded 9-1?
The new GCSE Maths and English will be graded as 9-1 (meaning your son or daughter will leave with a Maths and English award of 9-1).
- What is the Year 11 target?
This is the target grade for all students based on their Key Stage 2 level and their performance in Year 6 in English and Maths. It is based on levels of progress from their Year 6 Maths level.
- Will my son / daughter receive an aspirational target?
Sir William Ramsay School is an open mind-set school; as such we believe that students' aspirations should not be capped. All students are set aspirational targets (above national average) and during the Progress weeks students will be mentored by teaching staff where, through discussions with teachers, aspirational targets can be set for students.
- What does H/M/L mean on the Year 9 Maths reports?
H stands for Higher (top of the 9 – 1 grade), M represents middle and L denotes working to the lower end of that boundary.
